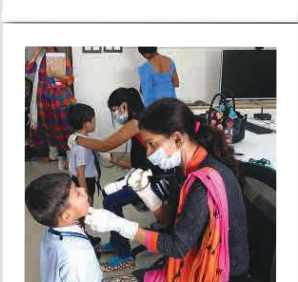
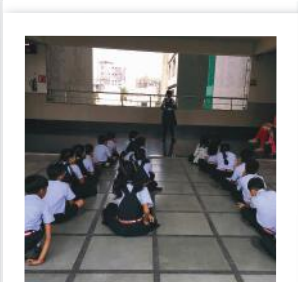

Prior to the commencement of the exercise, the students and staff were oriented through a PPT by the team of trained Fire Warden Ms. Sabiha Painter, Ms. Shweta Agarwal and Ms. Shilpa Musale along with the HSS Coordinator Ms. Priyanka Rani. They also explained and demonstrated the different types of fire extinguishers and their uses.
