TEACHER'S CORNER

Bullying is an unwanted, aggressive behaviour among people; it includes negative actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, excluding someone from group on purpose, name-calling, taunting, hitting, pushing, kicking, making rude hand and facial features. It can occur at any place, in any educational settings, playgrounds, in the buses, in neighbourhood etc.

It is mainly of 5 types; verbal, physical, emotional, social and cyber bullying.

It can affect everyone, the bullied, the bullies and the witnesses also. It can have negative outcomes including impact on mental health, substance use, physical health, social life and overall health and wellbeing.

4. Awareness programmes should be organized on regular basis for bullying and the ways to deal with it. Students should be motivated to take part in such motivational talks in schools.
5. These issues should be handled with utmost care and sensitivity to help the students in the most effective ways.
